Bullard stated that his thoughts were to get computers for the Zoning Commission and the BZA.

Disaster Plan, Password Policy & Upgrade Computers Cont'd- O'Brien stated that he spoke with Chris Ballard and he confirmed that buying new computers with the COVID Cares Funding Act would be an acceptable use of the money. O'Brien stated that the five laptops that were already purchased for the three trustees, the fiscal officer and the assistant fiscal officer could not be reimbursed but all new ones for any and all township employees that have to work remotely due to COVID could be bought with no problem. Smith questioned what would be done with the five laptops that have already been bought as she feels doing nothing with them would be a waste of taxpayer's money. O'Brien stated they could be given to employees that do not need to work from home. O'Brien stated that he has had some issues with booting his up. Bullard agreed but feels it is a set-up issue not necessarily an issue with the computer itself. O'Brien stated that there is approximately \$500,000 that he does not see what else it could be spent on. Smith feels that although it is available it does not need to be spent foolishly. D'Amico suggested that all the departments be contacted to see who wants one and come back with a number of possible purchases, whether it be replacements for us or new ones for them.

Road Department-

OPWC Paperwork- Doug Riedel stated that the board needs to authorize someone to be able to sign the application and all other paperwork once the project has started. O'Brien asked why just under \$500,000 is the number we are asking for in grant money and feels it should be the same allowance as to what the city can ask for. Riedel stated that in their experience the OPWC grants are capped at \$500,000 so they have found if the grant request is just slightly under \$500,000 it has a greater chance of being approved at the state level. Riedel stated that the city has not received any grant larger than \$500,000.

WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvement herein above described is considered to be a priority need for the community and is a qualified project under the OPWC programs,

Riedel stated that the estimated cost for the construction of the project will be \$1.4 million. This amount does not include the cost of the road acquisitions or the amount the township is paying someone to get those road acquisitions. Bullard stated that the breakdown once all is added up will be the townships immediate cost of \$500,000 which includes the right-ofway expenses, the \$500,000 OPWC grant, a loan of \$500,000 through OPWC and \$150,000 from the county. Riedel will recalculate the percent between the county and the township for the loan.

Roads Truck Purchase- Bullard stated that Erwin had received a quote from Dexter and Peter Bilt. Both would make the truck similar to what our existing trucks are and expect it would allow a non-CDL driver the ability to drive it. Bullard stated that we could wait until January 2021 to order it so that it can be added into the 2021 budget. Smith stated there is \$93,000 for roads vehicles still remaining for 2020. She suggested if it is possible to order it with that amount then order it now. If not then wait until January 2021 to order it as it was not figured into the 2020 budget.

September Bank Reconciliation and Electronic Payments- The September bank reconciliation and electronics payments balanced. Smith stated that if there is money that is planned to be spent in 2021, she needs the trustees to get it to her ASAP.

Trustee Items- D'Amico stated that they will follow up with talking to the Township's departments and get a tally with those who work virtually about getting computers for them through the COVID Cares Funding Act, with the understanding that the computers would belong to the township. Smith asked if that meant the trustees will be telling all the employees including the ones that come into the office, that they can work virtually. O'Brien stated that the Board of Zoning Appeals and Zoning Commission would qualify but as far as those employees that go to the office daily, that would be a question that would have to be answered by Ballard.

Smith asked O'Brien about what he had found out about getting carpet throughout the Township Hall. He stated that they had not gotten back to him so he will have to get another quote from someone else.

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, 116 Public Law 136, (the CARES Act) was signed into law by the President of the United States on March 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio General Assembly established a process for distributing funds provided by the "Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act" in House Bill 481 and House Bill 614 of the 133rd General Assembly (HB 481 & HB 614); and

WHEREAS, HB 481 & HB 614 require subdivisions receiving funds under Section 1 of the act, to pass a resolution affirming that funds from the County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund may be expended only to cover costs of the subdivision consistent with the requirements of section 5001 of the CARES Act as described in 42 U.S.C. 601(d), and any applicable regulations before receiving said funds; and

WHEREAS, Berlin Township is requesting its share of funds from the Delaware County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of Trustees of Berlin Township affirms that all funds received from the Delaware County Coronavirus Relief Distribution Fund pursuant to HB 481 & HB 614 be expended <u>only</u> to cover costs of the Township consistent with the requirements of section 5001 of the CARES Act as described in 42 U.S.C. 601(d), and any applicable regulations and guidance only to cover expenses that:

(1) Are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19);

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- (2) Were not accounted for in Berlin Township's most recently approved budget as of March 27, 2020; and
- (3) Were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 30, 2020.

FURTHERMORE, in compliance with HB 481 and HB 614, be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of Berlin Township that the Berlin Township Fiscal Officer take all necessary action to:

- (1) On or before November 20, 2020, pay any unencumbered balance of money in the Berlin Township's local coronavirus relief fund to the Delaware County Treasurer;
- (2) Use money in Berlin Township's local coronavirus relief fund for expenses incurred on or before December 30, 2020, and hold the fund open during the period beginning December 31, 2020, and February 1, 2021, only for account reconciliation and other similar purposes;
- (3) On or before February 1, 2021, pay the balance of any money in the Berlin Township's local coronavirus relief fund to the state treasury in the manner prescribed by the Director of the Ohio Office of Budget and Management; and
- (4) Provide any information related to any payments received under HB 481 and HB 614 to the Director of the Ohio Office of Budget and Management as requested.
